# The role of parents in providing careers advice and how they can be better supported

An International evidence report from the Institute of Employment Research at the University of Warwick which explores the role which parents play in a young person's career decision making has been published. The report suggests ways that schools and colleges can better support parents and involve them in the career guidance process.

# Skills shortage doubled in the last decade

A new survey, Closing the Skills Gap: What UK Workers Want in 2020 finds that the skills shortage has doubled in the last 10 years with almost one quarter of employers unable to find employees with the right skillset. Skilled workers such as mechanics, electricians and welders are a priority and jobs within healthcare, accounting and finance, management and teaching listed as within the top five.



#### **Disability Confident Employers**

This from Gov.uk, is a regularly updated list of employers in the UK who have signed up to the disability confident scheme. The list is currently 15,832 strong of which 76% are "committed" which is the first level of sign up to the scheme, the others being Employer and Leader. Guidance is available on the site. In terms of finding local employers in the csv file, then this requires a bit of filtering using postcodes and your knowledge of local to you place names. It could do with a bit of tidying up as it looks like data is taken directly from the employer input with quite a few mistypes.

# **Winners and Losers**

The BBC report on the highest earners and those who lose out following taking a degree depending on the subject they have studied. Some interesting facts and well worth a read. A couple of findings are, for example:

- For women, the financial gains of studying creative arts and languages are "close to zero" but worth an extra £340,000 if they've studied medicine, £270,000 economics and £260,000 for law.
- Men studying creative arts subjects are projected to lose £100,000, compared to their counterparts who did not go to university.

# Where are the jobs?

#### **Empowering women report**

Business Live report on the best and worst places in the UK for empowering women with the South West featuring in the number one slot and South East coming in fifth position. London is bottom at 12th position. The report, Women in Work index, provided by PwC looked at employment levels, pay and unemployment rates and it seems that the South West is benefitting from its concentration of a large hospitality sector and a prevalence of public sector jobs. The UK, however, does not fair so well, having remained fairly stagnant since 2000 at 17th position across 32 other OECD countries (Organisation of Economic Cooperation and Development).

## **United Response**

United Response who support individuals with learning disabilities, mental or physical support needs was founded in West Sussex but now work in over 300 locations across England and Wales and employ over 4,000 staff. They currently have vacancies.

#### Volunteers required to work for the NHS

The Health Secretary, Matt Hancox has appealed to the nation to volunteer to support the NHS. There are a number of roles available.

#### **Offshore Energy**

The offshore wind industry has announced plans to recruit 3,000 new apprentices by 2030 including a higher BAME representation. Roles will include Turbine Technicians and Maintenance Engineers as well as roles in management and finance. # The number of young workers leaving London is on the rise


Research carried out by Totaljobs has found that the number of professionals leaving London is increasing, particularly those in the younger age bracket. The research indicates that this is due to many giving up hope of being able to own property due to the high prices.



#### **School leavers training to become Carers**

The BBC reports on school leavers training as Carers at a time when EU migration falls. The NHS is working with the Prince's Trust charity to provide training for 10,000 school leavers to work in non-clinical jobs at the start of their career.

This comes as the Home Secretary announced that as from 1<sup>st</sup> January 2021 there will be a <u>new points-based immigration system</u> based on specific skills, qualifications, salaries or professions with visas being awarded to those who gain enough points. The Government sate that this "will end the reliance on cheap, low-skilled labour coming into the country." All applicants will be required to have a job offer with a minimum salary of £25,000 (with the exception being season agricultural workers' route). The current estimate of non-UK nationals working in the UK is 3.65 million' this is around 11% of the workforce.



There are many vacancies within the care industry at this time due to providing cover during the coronavirus. Check local websites for opportunities.

# Temple Island could create many jobs within Bristol

Plans are afoot to create a new district within Bristol. Temple Island would see new housing and include a hotel and conference centre. If successful, the project could create 1,500 jobs.

# Working Futures 2017 - 2027

The latest version of the Working Futures has been published. The report provides insight into the employment prospects for the UK, its counties and regions. What the authors say about their work is...

"The future cannot be predicted with precision or certainty. However, all the participants in the labour market make plans for the future. The rationale behind



Working Futures is that a comprehensive, systematic, consistent and transparent set of projections can help to inform everyone about the world they are likely to face. The Working Futures projections are grounded in a forecast of the future macroeconomic and labour market context. This is especially difficult at the present time with all the uncertainties associated with Brexit. The forecast is therefore subject to a number of risks and uncertainties. Most notable among them is the impact of Brexit on barriers to trade and the movement of people".

#### Some of the headlines are:

- the main growth (as it has been for some time) in employment is expected to be in the private sector around business services
- self-employment will fall back as people move back into being employees as the economy (and employment) improves following the 2008 fiscal crisis
- most of the newly created jobs will be in part-time roles with male part-time roles particularly increasing
- there are expected to be net increases in the Professional, Associate Professional and Caring, Leisure and Service roles - and decreases in Administrative & Secretarial occupations; Skilled Trade occupations; and Process, Plant & Machine Operatives.
