Secretary of State designates Chamber to deliver Local Skills Improvement Plan across Sussex



Sussex Chamber of Commerce are delighted to announce that they have been chosen to lead the development and delivery of the Local Skills Improvement Plan (LSIP) for Brighton and Hove, East Sussex and West Sussex.

Following the successful development of the Trailblazer LSIP for Sussex, published in April 2022, the Chamber have now been designated as the Employer Representative Body to take forward the LSIP for Sussex, as they are rolled out across the country.

Over the coming weeks we will be working with Department for Education (DfE) colleagues to finalise our LSIP delivery plans through to March 2025, which will enable us to continue the work started during the LSIP Trailblazer.

We will be taking these plans forward by bringing together and working in partnership with employers, training providers and other key stakeholders across Sussex, to continue to respond to the skills priorities and solutions identified within our LSIP report and the associated Future Skills Sussex Improvement Framework.

LSIPs have been placed on a statutory footing through the Skills and Post-16 Education Act 2022 and this guidance sets out the process for the rollout of LSIPs across the country and includes the process for developing and reviewing an LSIP. Digital Sector - Reports now published

We're pleased to announce that we have now published the Digital Sector Deep Dive report on our website.

The report is broken down into an overall **Executive Summary** which highlights the key findings, skills challenges and priorities for change within the Digital Sector, as well as conclusions and recommendations for further action.

There is also an **Evidence Base report** that accompanies the main Executive Summary. This report is broken down into sections what provide information, data and resource links on the skills demand, skills supply, careers services and strategic initiatives. **The aim of the evidence base is that partners can dip into the sections most appropriate to them and as they need.**

The findings and recommendations from the Digital Sector Deep Dive will be used going forward with our development and delivery of the LSIP and we will work with partners to take forward any actions.

This Deep Dive has been a pilot undertaken on limited resources and will be the basis for future Deep Dives into all the Sussex LSIP Key Sectors.
